When all gifts have been opened, the first player can swap their gift for another in play. When no further swaps occur, the game is over.



FROM MY "EASY" TOOL KIT TO YOURS! BY BARONESS ARWEN

PANEER!

Easy cheese for home or camp - take one gallon of whole milk, bring to a gentle boil.



Turn off heat right when the boil starts and pour in 1/4 cup of lemon juice or vinegar, stir it in (the liquid might turn yellow or greenish, that's okay). Curds will form right away. Let it sit for about 10 or so minutes, strain through a double layer of cheese cloth, rinse with cold water*, gather up the cheese cloth around the cheese and gently squeeze excess liquid out. Fold the cheese cloth over and around your cheese to make a little packet, set it between two plates, and put something

heavy on top. Leave it for a couple hours, and voila! Cheese!!! *you can add salt or other seasonings after rinsing and before pressing

DOUBLET PATTERN!

Find a collared dress shirt that fits you well, take it apart carefully by either opening the seams with a seam ripper or cutting at all the seam lines (if you cut, you'll need to add a bit of seam allowance to your pieces when you cut). Use the cut apart pieces as a pattern to cut your fashion fabric, and if the shirt was all cotton or linen, you can use those pieces as lining too! Shape the bottom edge in the desired style. This can work for a gown as well by lengthening the shirt pieces to the desired length and adding gores.

DID YOU KNOW?

Caid – (Arabic: qa id "commander") also spelled kaid or caid, means "master" or "leader." It was a title in the Norman Kingdom of Sicily, applied to palatine officials and members of the curia. Later the word was used in North Africa for the governor of a fortress or the warden of a prison, and also in Spain and Portugal in the form with the definite article, al-cayde. The title alcaide was used to refer to the mayor of Spanish towns.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

OR HOW YOU CAN GET INVOLVED IN LYONDEMERE

Looking for a way to become more involved within Lyondemere? We have several volunteer officer and deputy positions that need to be filled and/or need assistants! Here's a list of the offices and what they do:

The Tpdes

Arts & Sciences Minister: This position focuses on advancing work in the field of Arts & Sciences (A&S); being a resource person for your group; facilitating research, creative artistic and scientific work, as well as teaching activities; and recording (through your reports) what happens in Lyondemere A&S. You don't have to be an expert in everything A&S to do the job; you just need to know how to track down resources and share information. The handbook for A&S Ministers may be found <u>here</u>.

Chatelaine & Keys: The Office of the Chatelaine exists in order to inform the public about the SCA, to invite interested or curious individuals to participate and join, and to provide instruction and workshops for new members so that they will become fully participating members. The handbook for Chatelaines may be found <u>here</u>.

Constable: The Office of the Constable is responsible for: keeping the peace at Kingdom-sanctioned events, making and enforcing such regulations concerning events as appropriate to insure safety and orderly participation therein (not including SCA combat), and operating the Lost & Found. The handbook for Constables may be found <u>here</u>. **Lysts**: The Lysts Officer is in charge of pairing fighters for tournaments and recording the results. The handbook for Lysts may be found <u>here</u>.

Youth Activities: In general, the local Youth Activities Officer provides opportunities for parents and other adults to engage in age appropriate activities with youth members by providing ideas, games, crafts, stories, and songs for parents to work with their children and the children of others. Youth Officers ensure that sufficient leadership is provided for all activities, and have the right and duty to cancel activities when the necessary two adults are not available.
