
Facebook, usually right before the meeting. If you need the link over email or text, just let us know. We'll make sure you can join us.

It's Autumn and the mind turns to the month of October and Halloween which is just over the horizon. The bookshelves these days creak and groan under the weight of numerous volumes bearing tales of vampires, ghosts, and other mysterious creatures.


Lest we think that ghosts and apparitions weren't of concern in past times, one may look to two works that appeared in Elizabethan England. In the 1570s two very different works appeared on the subject. One is compre-

hensive and runs to 220 pages. The other relates an account of strange happenings in Norwich in somewhat less than 16 pages. Both offer a glimpse into what Elizabethans had the opportunity to

Robert Harrison is the R.H. who translated the work into English.] It was published in 1572 and again in 1596 in London. Both editions are 220 pages.

Ludwig Lavater or as given on the title page Lewes Lauaterus of Tigurine was a well-known Swiss Reformation pastor and theologian. While serving as an archdeacon in Zurich, he published numerous sermons and full-length volumes, including this work on spirits. (Professor Peter Marshall of the University of Warwick has referred to him as

> the "pre-eminent Protestant ghost authority of the age.") Lavater's book De spectris, lemuribus et magnis atque insolitis fragoribus was published in 1570 and ran to at least nineteen editions in numerous languages. The English translation




to such strange things.

The first work by Ludwig Lavater (1527-1586) is: Of ghostes and spirites walking by nyght and of strange novses, crackes, and sundry forewarnynges, whiche commonly happen before the death of menne, great slaughters [and] alterations of kyngdomes. One booke, written by Lewes Lauaterus of Tigurine. And translated into Englyshe by R.H. [One

read about and think about when it came of Lavater is the earliest work to be catalogued under the subject heading "Apparitions -- Early works to 1800" in the English Short Title Catalogue (ESTC) database. [Nothing is catalogued under "Ghosts" before 1643.]

Of Ghostes and Spirites Walking proves to be a comprehensive encyclopedia or treatise on the subjects of 'Spirites, and divers other divinations of things to come." It offers a chapter on "Melancholike persones and madde men," and another titled "Men whiche are dull of seing and hearing, imagine many things which in very dede are not so." This is followed a chapter "Many are so feared by other menne, that they suppose they have heard or seene Spirites." Lavater in "CHAP. XVI. Daily experience techeth vs that spirits do appear to mē (men)" also includes mountain spirits, such as trolls or elves. "And some other call them Elues, or Dwarfes of the Mountaynes, thereby notyng theyr small stature, wherein they commonly appeare. They séeme to bée hoare, wearyng apparayle lyke the mettall fyners, that is, in a petycote laced, and an apron of lether about their loynes. These hurte not the laborers, excepte they misuse them, but do imitate them in all their doings." The Brothers Grimm would later incorporate some of these tales and descriptions into their own collections.

Counterfeit and deceiving spirits are discussed, including those at Orleans and at Clauenna. The author discusses the "manye naturall thyngs are taken to bee ghostes" including the proof in chapters titled "that ghostes doe oftentymes appeare," and "that Spirits are sometime seene and heard, and that other strange matters do often chaunce." The author offers much comment on the scriptures and ghosts, including "Whether the holy Apostles thought they sawe a mans soule, when Chryste sodeynlye appeared vnto them after his Resurrection" and "Howe Christian menne oughte to behaue themselues when they se spirits, and first that they ought to have a good courage, and to be stedfast in fayth. On this subject he offers a chapter titled: "It they be always thankful for so great a behoueth them whiche are vexed with



spirites, to praye especiallie, and to giue themselues to fasting, sobrietie, watching, and vpright and godly lyuing. He even includes "That sundrie kindes of superstition haue crepte in, whereby men haue attempted to driue away spirits" and the effects of "cursing and banning" spirits. Lastly, Lavater offers a final chapter "After what sorte we oughte to behaue oure selues, when we heare straunge crackes, or when other forewarnings happen."

Lavater ends with the prayer: "Glorie and prayse be vnto Almightie God for euer and euer, and I beséech him to voutsafe to stretche forthe hys hande, to deliuer all suche as are still entangled in superstition and errours, and to graunt those whome he hath delyuered hys Heauenly grace, that benefite, least they be wrapped againe

in the same mischiefe."

The other pre 1600 work catalogued on this same subject is by Abraham Fleming, [1552?-1607]. This 1577 work is titled: A straunge and terrible wunder wrought very late in the the parish church of Bongay, a tovvn of no great distance from the citie of Norwich, namely the fourth of this August, in ve yeere of our Lord 1577 in a great tempest of violent raine, lightning, and thunder, the like wherof hath been seldome seene. With the appearance of an horrible shaped thing, sensibly perceiued of the the people then and there assembled. Drawen into a plain method according to the written copye. by Abraham Fleming. (At only sixteen pages with a number of included duplicate pages, the title is almost as long as the book.)

Fleming recounts the strange and mysterious events of Sunday, August 4th, 1577 in the village of Bongay or Bungay, which lies some ten miles from Norwich. While the villagers were assembled in church, a terrible storm of rain, lightning, thunder and strong winds did break out. The author then writes "Immediatly héerupon, there appéered in a moste horrible similitude and likenesse to the congregation then & there present, a dog as they might discerne it, of a black colour: at the sight wherof, togither with the fearful flashes of fire which then were séene, moued such admiration in the mindes of the assemblie, that they thought doomes day was already come." Two people kneeling in prayer strangely died as the black

beast or wraith passed them. The same beast also appeared that same day in Bilbery where more people died. "This mischief thus wrought, he flew with wonderful force to no litle feare of the assembly, out of the Church in a hideous and hellish likenes. These things are reported to be true..." The author concludes his tale with a prayer to the Almighty.

The tale of the Black Dog or Hellhound is interesting because numerous English places claim a specter of a Black Dog, and there are numerous books regarding these sightings and legends. Meanwhile, Bungay still exists as a town in Suffolk. It actively celebrates and embraces the appearance of the "Black Dog" and the events of 1577. (See < https://bungay-suffolk.co.uk/? s=black+dog > for their modern take on the tale.) Numerous books regarding the

Black Dog have been published, including even children's books wherein modern children encounter the Black Dog, and there is at least one graphic novel. Bungay is the site of a Black Dog Festival and home of the Bungay Black Dog Marathon

Looking for a way to become more involved within Lyondemere? We have several volunteer officer and deputy positions that need to be filled and/or need assistants! Here's a list of the offices and what they do:

Arts & Sciences Minister: This position focuses on advancing work in the field of Arts & Sciences sults. The handbook for Lysts may be found (A&S); being a resource person for your group; facilitating research, creative artistic and scientific work, as well as teaching activities; and recording (through your reports) what happens in Lyondemere A&S. You don't have to be an expert in everything A&S to do the job; you just need to know how to track down resources and share information. The handbook for A&S Ministers may be found here.

Chatelaine & Keys: The Office of the Chatelaine exists in order to inform the public about the SCA, to invite interested or curious individuals to participate and join, and to provide instruction and workshops for new members so that they will become fully participating members. The handbook for Chatelaines may be found here.

Constable: The Office of the Constable is responsible for: keeping the peace at Kingdomsanctioned events, making and enforcing such regulations concerning events as appropriate to insure safety and orderly participation therein (not including SCA combat), and operating the Lost & Found. The handbook for Constables may be found here.

Lysts: The Lysts Officer is in charge of pairing

fighters for tournaments and recording the rehere.

Youth Activities: In general, the local Youth Activities Officer provides opportunities for parents and other adults to engage in age appropriate activities with youth members by providing ideas, games, crafts, stories, and songs for parents to work with their children and the children of others. Youth Officers ensure that sufficient leadership is provided for all activities, and have the right and duty to cancel activities when the necessary two adults are not available. Opening Comments:

Baron & Baroness / Arwen & Guillem: Arwen: Thank you for all the help from the weekend, it was wonderful. Great to get back to in-person events! Need more info on the participants from A&A.

Seneschal/ Mercy: Happy to see everyone. Will be away for the next meeting.

Officer Reports:

- Arts and Sciences / Cecilia: Nothing to report.
- Châtelaine / Geiri: Nothing to report.
- Children / Vacant:
- Chronicler / Raffi: Happy New SCA year! Thanks for all the content that was mailed to me as of last week. Need to contact the new Kingdom Chronicler about missing Tydes editions (November 2021 and February 2022) on their end.
- Constable / Geiri: Was constable at A&A, will return Lost and Found article to its owner.
- Exchequer / Tetchubah: Technically no longer Exchequer, this is her last report. Have about \$4k in bank account. Will be used up by the cost of the thrones and Anniversary site expenses. Balance will be at the lowest point since 2008. Might want to look at fundraising. Can take \$800 from Black Rose Ball if transferred from Culinary; there are a few uncashed checks too. Money from A&A will not help much as it will pay for the storage unit. Barony has \$203 in cooking guild, will move funds to General for now. Only \$47 in the Archer's Fund. Last Archer's check was \$300. Anniversary: Request for insurance certificate sent to the office. Haldorr: Money due to Torrance Unified for the in June (not allowed to do electronic payments unless using credit card and getting reimbursed).

- Lists / Sechen: Geiri did A&A Lists. Everything went well.


